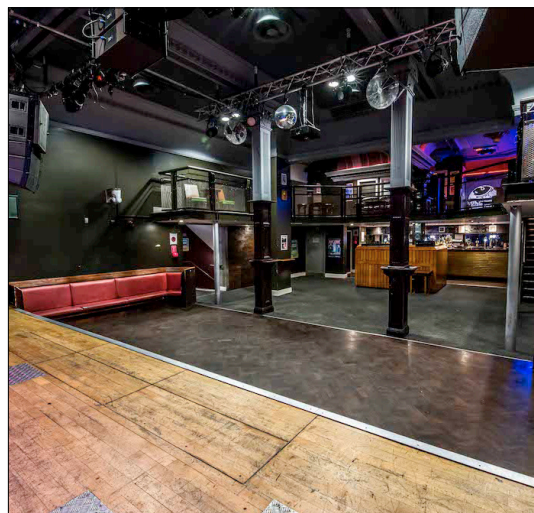

PROJECTS***Band on the Wall***

A £1.64m scheme to refurbish a 19th Century grade 2 listed former Public House and live music venue in the fashionable Northern Quarter of Manchester. The name Band on the Wall derives from the 1930's, when the landlord placed a stage high on the far wall of the pub. The scope for the "New" Band on the Wall was to continue the legacy of promoting education for all ages and backgrounds. This was achieved by providing a centre of excellence, building on the venue's track record of artistic quality, employment creation, school development (by way of dedicated

educational and recording studio facilities), innovation and cultural diversity. Jamie worked alongside the Project Architect playing a pivotal role from the detailed design stage and throughout construction operations on site. The project was complex in nature and necessitated working closely with the design team and the main contractor. The main elements of the work involved the insertion of a new service core allowing disabled access to the new upper floor office and educational spaces as well as major refurbishment of the main sound stage and Picturehouse.
